PROGRAMS

UNITED WAY'S ABORIGINAL RELATIONS STRATEGY

Led by the Aboriginal Relations Council, the Strategy continues to cultivate relationships and inspire volunteer participation within and between Winnipeg's Aboriginal community and the community at large. One of the strategy's latest outcomes is a second edition of Eagle's Eye View – an environmental scan of the Aboriginal community. As well, United Way continues to play a role in an annual research and education forum involving Aboriginal peoples.

UNITED WAY'S BUILDING BLOCKS PROGRAM

Last year, dozens of Winnipeggers used this small grants program to bring neighbours together through block parties, barbecues, workshops and community garden projects. Ideas that provide opportunities for neighbours to connect and build safer, stronger communities are eligible for grants between \$100 and \$1000.

UNITED WAY'S DAY OF CARING PROGRAM

A unique opportunity for workplaces, schools and organizations to help United Way agency partners complete short-term projects or special events that contribute to the health and well-being of Winnipeg neighbourhoods. Projects range from landscaping, painting, and rejuvenating play structures to community celebrations and clean-ups.

UNITED WAY'S GENNEXT COUNCIL

Hundreds of business and community leaders aged 25 – 40 have made a difference in our community through GenNext activities. GenNexters have welcomed kids into their workplaces as part of a work experience program and for the last three years have organized and participated in a massive Day of Caring in Gilbert Park.

UNITED WAY'S KOATS FOR KIDS PROGRAM

A seasonal partnership that collects and distributes gently used winter outerwear free of charge to Winnipeg children and families. Partners include United Way, The Winnipeg Sun, CTV, 1290 CFRW, Winnipeg Fire Paramedic Service, Perth's and AMJ Campbell Van Lines.

UNITED WAY'S YOUTH ENGAGEMENT STRATEGY

Encourages young volunteers to sharpen their leadership skills through a series of youth engagement activities and programs driven by the Youth Relations Council. The strategy has proven extremely effective in bringing young leaders together to help shape the future of our city and take action on important youth issues.



YOUTH LEADERS IN ACTION

Since 2007, youth volunteers have awarded a total of \$10,000 in scholarships to 20 outstanding young Winnipeggers who are leading a new generation of volunteers.

SHAW UNITED WAY YOUTH CONNECTIONS

Since 2000, youth volunteers have awarded over \$160,000 in grants, resulting in 184 youth-driven projects aimed at addressing specific needs within a student's own school and/or neighbourhood.

STUDENT COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD

Last year, 52 grade 11 students were recognized for making significant volunteer contributions to our community.

YOUTH DAY OF CARING

In May 2011, nearly 150 students from 12 high schools united to make a visible and valuable difference in the West Broadway neighbourhood. Over the past six years more than 750 young people have worked together to make Winnipeg a better place through this annual event.
